Dear Competitor:

Invitation and Prize Fund

It is my pleasure to invite you to participate in the 2020 US National Hot Air Balloon Championship and International Challenge in Scotts Bluff County, Nebraska. Your governing body, the HACD, and the event organizer, Old West Balloon Fest, have agreed to add an exciting new element to this year's event. The USA and Canada will be running their country's National Championship simultaneously utilizing one consolidated staff. They will be scored as two separate events. An overall Champion including US, Canadian and other International pilots will be awarded a newly designed International Champion's Cup and all competitors. US, Canadian and any other International guests are eligible for the International Cup.



A prize fund of \$20,000 is guaranteed plus a \$200 travel stipend to be paid in the form of a gas card bringing the prize fund to a total of \$30,000. Canadian pilots will only be eligible to receive the minimum guaranteed payout of \$150 and a \$200 gas card. The competitive event officially starts with on-site pilot registration and the mandatory General Briefing on Sunday, August 9. The organizer and HACD are offering support for two formal training flights to familiarize all with the use of the FAI logger that will be used in this year's competition - Saturday and Sunday, August 8-9. The last competitive flight is scheduled for Saturday morning followed by a mandatory evening glow that will be the final flight operation of the Championship. The closing ceremony, awards and brunch are scheduled for Sunday morning August 16 allowing all participants to hit the road early for the return home.

Housing and Meetings

The organizer is providing a complimentary hotel room for pilots with check in starting Sunday, August 9 and check out Sunday, August 16. Pilots wishing to arrive early may do so at their own expense and may reserve space once acceptance is confirmed. Once you have been accepted in the Championship you will be sent an acceptance confirmation. In a major improvement for 2020, the organizer has secured the Hampton Inn and Conference Center as the host hotel for all pilots, crew and event staff. All pilot briefings and associated meetings will take place at the hotel's on-site Conference Center. Details on the hotel can be found here: [Hampton Inn & Suites](#). **All arrangements for early arrival and crew rooms will need to be made directly by the competitor. You will have to contact the hotel and provide arrival and departure details as well as provide a credit card.**

Propane will be available on the mornings of August 8-9 for pilots arriving early and wishing to fly practice flights. Pilots will be charged a flat fee of \$40 for each fill on these dates. Arrive full; leave full. The organizer is working to locate a suitable propane refueling site in close proximity to the host hotel.

US Nationals Mission and Background

Promoting competition in the US is the Mission of the HACD. The US National Championship is integral to this Mission. While the major goal of the US Nationals is to name the Champion, it also serves as the means to qualify to represent the US in International competition. We encourage pilots of all skill sets to participate. It is my goal as Director to encourage new participation, provide nurturing training during the event and assist any new competitor to find an experienced mentor to provide important counseling throughout the event. I certainly recognize that many competitors may not be willing or available to assist during each competitive flight, but much can be learned from post flight analysis and brainstorming. There is no pressure to fly any flight; all go/no-go decisions are the sole responsibility of each competitor and there is no stigma to sitting out a flight.

Several learning and skill development opportunities exist throughout the Championship including the following:

- Two full practice flights designed as learning experiences including post flight debriefings with an open forum led by event staff.

- Daily post-flight flight debriefings led by a top competitor. These sessions discuss an analysis of the tasks and the decisions made in the planning and execution phase of that day's flight.
- A BFA sanctioned safety seminar will be provided throughout the week built around 1 to 1 ½ hour sessions held at convenient times
- Our staff is developing an on-line training video to fully explain the FAA Waiver for the event. Competitors will have to pass an on-line quiz on the Waiver details prior to arriving for the General Briefing.

The Championship will again utilize the FAI logger in order to better align our Championship with the capabilities afforded us with this technology. You are encouraged to familiarize yourself with all rules and policies involving the use of GPS loggers and the need to equip yourself with a backup GPS that meets the requirements of the rules. It is the intent of the HACD to post educational videos to the BFA/HACD web site prior to the event and we encourage you to take advantage of them. Topics being considered include: FAI logger, highlights of 2020 rule changes, scoring area definitions and examples and an electronic task tutorial.

Old West Balloon Fest and I are confident that this year's Championship will be well attended and a challenging exciting experience for both seasoned competitors and those new to the US Nationals. This summer's event will serve as your first opportunity to qualify for the 2022 World Hot Air Balloon Championship. It will also serve as one of the qualifying events, along with the US Women's Nationals and Junior Nationals, for the 2021-2022 Women's and Junior World Championship. Please note that a new HACD policy was enacted in 2019 which states:

Beginning January 1, 2022, for all FAI Sanctioned hot air competitions for which the Balloon Federation of America is invited to select participants, Women and Junior competitors wishing to participate are required to have participated in the US National Championship sometime in the previous five years in order to gain experience in complex tasking, flying in tight quarters and working with team members.

Application Deadline – April 15, 2020

Applications must be received in the BFA Office on or before April 15, 2020. You can mail your application or complete the attached forms, scan and email it to the BFA office. Applications need to be sent in paper format mailed to the office or by pdf files. We cannot accept photos taken of the completed applications, win zip compressed applications nor compressed jpgs to pdf.

Participation in this year's event is limited to a maximum of fifty (50) competitors qualifying through the National Eligibility System plus those pilots qualifying for the Canadian National Championship. We encourage you to submit your application early. You will be notified by email of your acceptance no later than April 22.

Women and Junior Competitors

The Organizer has generously provided for organizer exemptions for women and juniors desiring to use the US Nationals as a qualifier for their possible participation in International competition. Women and juniors not otherwise qualifying in the top fifty spots will be provided a spot in the US Nationals if it is your intention to use the event to qualify for participation in an upcoming World Championship. This is a unique opportunity and hopefully many will take advantage. It's important to note that these exemptions in no way impact the normal top fifty selection process.

Acceptance

Your application will be considered complete when we receive your completed application form, digital (JPG) photo of your balloon and yourself (head shot only), \$200 entry fee (you can use BFA web site [BFA Store](#)) payable to the BFA and a completed balloon-related biography. **Entry fee for Canadian national pilots is \$250 US.** The US National pilot list will be posted on the BFA website no later than April 30, 2020. A waiting list will be maintained for all applications received beyond the fifty qualifying slots available. Plans often change and last-minute slots may be available. Even if your position in the 2019 National Eligibility System is well below the top fifty, you are encouraged to apply if you have an interest in competing. All women and juniors desiring to use this Championship as a qualifier for your respective World Championship are especially encouraged to register. Under no circumstances will pilot

entries be filled from the waiting list after August 1, 2020. We ask that you submit your application only when all requested information is complete.

Insurance

The Organizer and the BFA/HACD require that each participating pilot name the sponsoring organizations, venues and others directly involved in the organization and sponsoring of this event as additionally insured on their balloon insurance policy. We have reviewed this requirement with Aviation Insurance Resources and RPS/IMC Balloon Insurance agencies and have been assured by those agencies that they have no issues with this requirement. Additionally insureds will include: Cities of Scottsbluff, Gering and Mitchell, Oregon Trail Community Foundation and Scotts Bluff County.

Selection and Participation

The United States Championship is open to all US BFA/HACD member pilots who are in good standing. Acceptance preference is based on the 2019 NEL should applications exceed the available slots. All US pilots will have participation priority over any Canadian entries regardless of NEL participation or finish. The selection process for the available spots is fully explained in the ***BFA Competition Regulations, Policies and Procedures***.

Pilots registering are expected to remain and participate for the entire duration of the event as required by the HACD Code of Conduct. With the exception of family emergencies, medical situations and other obvious events outside of the pilot's control, early departure from the event carries financial penalties and may include, regardless of NEL standing, DQ from State, Regional, National and International competition for the next year. Pilots are encouraged to be familiar with all the rules and seek any clarification needed either prior to the event or at the General Briefing.

On-site Registration

A Preliminary Registration will be available Saturday morning before the first official practice flight and afternoon at the Hampton Inn Conference Center for those interested in practice flights before formal registration. The FAA will examine documents at this time and the FAA Waiver, maps and area information will be available at this time.

Official Pilot Registration for all pilots will be held on Sunday, August 9 from 1:00 – 4:00 PM at the Hampton Inn Conference Center. All pilot packs, tickets, maps, banners, etc. will be distributed at that time. FAA staff from the Lincoln, Nebraska FSDO will be present to examine pilot and balloon documents. Be sure you have a current balloon registration.

Corporate Balloons

Spots are available for Corporate Balloons wishing to participate during the week or during the weekend activities. If you are interested in advertising product, company, service, or identifiable artwork, logos, etc. you are welcome to participate. Commercial balloon entry fees are \$1,500 and are payable to the BFA. If you have associated



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merchandise you would like to offer for sale you need to contact Colleen Johnson at Old West Balloon Fest directly (colleenjohnson302@gmail.com) for booth information, pricing and availability.

Social Events

Planned social events during the week include Sunday Welcome BBQ, Thursday Pilot/Sponsor Dinner and Sunday Awards Brunch. The HACD will also schedule an open general membership meeting lunch around other flight and social events.

Volunteer Crew

We will make every effort to provide local crew should you need such. Please indicate on the Pilot Application the number of crew members you would like us to provide for each scheduled flight.

If you are provided local crew, we ask that you provide them with the complimentary meal tickets that are given to you or purchase additional tickets as needed. If your plans or needs change, we ask that you notify the volunteer coordinator immediately so that the volunteers can be reassigned. Our volunteer coordinator is Peggie Michaels and her contact information will be made available in your acceptance confirmation package.

Maps

Each participating pilot is provided two official full color competition maps of the primary competition area. Once finalized, you will be provided a link to digital versions (several file formats) of the competition map.

Map development will be available for viewing thru its finalization using this link: [US National Map Drop Box](#). Printed maps will be available at on-site registration.

Airspace

A portion of competitive flight operations are within the Class E airspace of Western Nebraska Regional Airport (KBFF). The facility is fully cooperating with our event and operations personnel to ensure a safe event. No ATC clearance or radio communication is required for VFR flight in Class E airspace. You are expected to be familiar with all requirements when operating in Class E airspace. Our staff will include critical elements of operating in this airspace in the pilot safety training video.

Other

Further information on rules, schedule updates, competition maps, etc. will be posted to the Official Notice Board on [Watchmefly.net](#) as available and applicants should check the site frequently. It is my intent to rely heavily on this web site's Official Notice Board, Remind Messaging System and e-mail correspondence to keep everyone posted on current developments.

4. **You must view the event safety video, complete the quiz and receive a passing grade prior to July 20, 2020**
5. All balloons must arrive fully fueled
6. Quick-release tie off restraint required and must be used on all common launch areas
7. Entry fee, commercial and non-commercial, bio and photos must accompany your application
8. Your additionally insured insurance certificate must be submitted to the BFA Office prior to July 20, 2020
9. You must arrive on time for registration, General Briefing and be present for all flight briefings
10. Application must be completely filled out
11. You must submit IRS Form W-9. Form may be downloaded using this link: [IRS Form W-9](#). **Download, complete and sign.**

PILOT ENTRY AGREEMENT

Including Acknowledgement of Responsibility and Release of Liability

I hereby declare that I am participating in the US National Hot Air Balloon Championship (**Championship**) on August 9 - 16, 2020 of my own free volition. I agree that the organizers and sponsors of this event (including the Cities of Scottsbluff, Gering and Mitchell, Oregon Trail Community Trail Foundation and Scotts Bluff County' Balloon Federation of America, event race officials, my sponsor or any subsidiaries, employees, officers, trustees, agents and/or members of the above mentioned entities) are providing me with the facilities and means for my participation in this event and in no way do they supersede the responsibility of the pilot in command, as shown in CFR § 91.3(a) and elsewhere in the Federal Aviation Regulations (FAR's).

I hereby certify that I am aware of and agree with the responsibility legally transferred to me under the Federal Aviation Regulations (FAR's) as regards my personal decision to fly my balloon, and any bodily injury or property damage resulting from there is solely my liability, and that my decision as pilot in command may affect my placement in this event if I choose not to fly. I understand that the pilot of each balloon has full and complete authority over the balloon and is responsible for all decisions to be made associated with the balloon on the ground and in the air.

I certify that I am of sound mind and body and I have no medical, mental, or physical limitations that would limit my ability to safely fly my aircraft. I am not taking prescription or over the counter drugs that may impair my ability to safely fly my aircraft.

Officials of the US and Canadian National Hot Air Balloon Championship may supply information, guidance, or data and will use reasonable care to ensure the information is accurate and complete. However, the BFA/HACD and Championship assumes no responsibility for the completeness or accuracy of such information. It is my decision whether to rely on that information or acquire additional information. I agree that none of the flights are mandatory and that I will make all flights at my option.

I hereby agree to have in full force during the Championship a balloon insurance policy with minimum liability limits of \$1,000,000 each occurrence combined bodily injury and property damage, including passengers, but not less than \$100,000 each passenger.

I hereby give permission, without any restriction, to the Championship or its assigns, to use still and motion pictures and sound recordings of me, my balloon, equipment, chase crewmembers, employees and agents for news, advertising, promotional media and commercial uses.

It is my understanding that the organizers may inspect all balloons entered in the event; but that such inspection is only for the purpose of determining whether the aircraft complies with all rules of eligibility of said event. The approval of the balloon by said officials does not constitute a representation or warranty of any kind or character whatsoever concerning the mechanical condition of the aircraft, or whether or not it is airworthy.

I acknowledge that the Championship utilizes GPS loggers for purposes of scoring and monitoring participant's flights for adherence to event regulations regarding landowner relations and Prohibited Zone infractions. I agree to carry this GPS logger on all flights and conform to all rules related to its use. I also acknowledge financial responsibility for the device while under my control.

I agree that this Agreement is a Nebraska contract and it is to be governed by the laws of the State of Nebraska, and that I hereby submit myself to the jurisdiction of the Nebraska courts concerning any claims arising out of the Championship or this Agreement. This Agreement, including the Conditions of Entry, General Information, Insurance and Hotel Reservation form, contains all the terms and conditions agreed to by the parties hereto, and no other agreements or discussions, oral or written, regarding the subject matter of the Agreement shall be deemed to exist or bind any of the parties hereto.

I, the pilot in command, hereby declare that I will fly in accordance with the event rules and regulations, HACD Code of Conduct, abide by the FAR's, and fly entirely at my own risk and waive any right of action against the Championship, the owner of the launch site, event race officials, my sponsor or any employees, officers, trustees, agents, and their respective members for any loss or damage sustained by me in consequence of any action or omission on their part, my part or the part of other participants.

Thus, I release the organizers and sponsors of this event (including the Cities of Scottsbluff, Gering and Mitchell, Oregon Trail Community Trail Foundation and Scotts Bluff County, Balloon Federation of America, event race officials, my sponsor or any subsidiaries, employees, officers, trustees, agents and/or members of the above mentioned entities) from liability for their actions or inactions relating to the Championship which may arise out of or result from or in any manner be connected with the balloon flight or activity in which I participate as a pilot in command.

BY MY SIGNATURE BELOW, I CERTIFY THAT ALL INFORMATION CONTAINED IN THE REGISTRATION IS ACCURATE AND I ACCEPT THE TERMS OF THIS ENTRY AGREEMENT.
